



City of Forest Hill partners with Trinity Metro to provide bus service to citizens

Forest Hill Route #71 will begin operations on Monday, November 5, 2018.

The City Council approved an agreement with Trinity Metro to provide transit service to the residents of the city to assist with getting people to jobs, education, and healthcare. The route will provide additional service to Tarrant County College South (TCC) as well as access to shopping, senior living and other landmarks within the city. More than 6,000 people will be within a quarter of a mile from a bus stop, and there are 1,800 jobs that are accessible on the new route. Funding for the Forest Hill route is provided through a \$1 million grant to provide public transportation as a pilot project in Everman, Crowley and Forest Hill; the two- year pilot program will utilize one third of the grant.

Forest Hill Route #71 will connect with other Trinity Metro service routes: 5B, 25 and 28 on Mansfield Highway and 3, 5A, 5B and 67X at TCC South. The route will have 32 bus stops, including city offices, the Civic & Convention Center, Foodland Market, the Forest Hill Senior Center and the Villas of Forest Hill. Service will be provided by a trolley similar to those used in downtown Fort Worth.

The fare structure will be \$2 for a single ride or \$5 for an all-day pass that is valid for all buses and rail in Tarrant County. For those who qualify, a reduced day pass is available for \$2.50.
