City Council Report

City Council Meeting, May 18, 2010

The Forest Hill City Council met at 6 p.m. Tuesday, May 18, 2010, with all members present. Following the invocation and pledges to the flags, Dick Ruddell, President/Executive Director of the Fort Worth Transportation Authority "The T," gave a presentation and responded to questions from the City Council.

• City Manager Sheyi Ipaye reported on the following:

A. Free summer lunch program for children to begin June 7 at two locations.

B. Summer internship program available funded through WorkForce.

C. Report on city-owned building at 3219 California Parkway and Public Works building at 3101 Horton Road.

• During Citizen Presentations, Adrian Duran reported on a new business on Mansfield Highway. Anne Frost and Andrea Tucker also spoke.

• After corrections were made, minutes of City Council Meetings held on March 9, March 26, April 23 and May 4 were unanimously approved as part of the consent agenda.

• A Resolution canvassing the results of the May 8 election was approved.

• Certificates of Election were issued to City Council Members Damian Dalcour and Lyndia Thomas along with Library Board Members Jerline Harvey and Bonnie Winkfield.

• The oath of office was issued to Dalcour, Thomas, Harvey and Winkfield.

• The city manager received authorization to proceed with repairs to the Anglin Drive Ballpark's roof on concession stand, light house roof and pump station stucco roof. Council Member Dalcour abstained from the vote. All else voted aye.

• The Council unanimously approved action on an appraisal service for the Griggs Park.

• Appointments to the Griggs Park Grant Advisory Group were unanimously approved.

• The Council briefly discussed participation in the South Tarrant Chamber of Commerce. No action was necessary.

• A towing fee ordinance was tabled with the mayor abstaining from the vote.

• Establishment of an abatement administration fee ordinance was approved in a split vote.

• A variance for the setback requirement for a sign in the 5100 block of California Parkway was unanimously approved.

• An amendment to the Zoning Ordinance adding a use of a parking lot to the schedule of uses was unanimously passed.

• The Council convened into executive session to discuss Charter Amendments relative to personnel issues and to discuss credit card policies and ethics issues.

City Council Meeting, June 1, 2010

The Forest Hill City Council met at 6 p.m. Tuesday, June 1, 2010. Mayor James Gosey was not present. Following the invocation and pledges to the flags, City Manager Sheyi Ipaye reported on the following:

A. Council Members recognition for training.

C. Police Department – 2010 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG), Light Detection and Ranging (LIDAR).

E. Fire Department – 2010 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG).

F. Update on the City of Forest Hill Building at 3219 California Parkway and Public Works Building at 3101 Horton Road.

G. Council Budget Workshop.

• The Council unanimously approved the minutes of the May 18, 2010 regular council meeting as part of the consent agenda.

• The Council briefly discussed the nomination of a new Mayor Pro Tem and tabled the item until the next meeting with one abstention and all else voting aye.

• An item regarding establishing the Mayor's Youth Council of Forest Hill was pulled since Mayor James Gosey was not there.

• An item regarding public transportation service for the residents of Forest Hill provided by the Fort Worth Transportation Authority "The T" was pulled since Mayor James Gosey was not there.

At the suggestion of Council Member Lyndia Thomas, the Council unanimously approved the development of a central bulletin board for posting City of Forest Hill business owners' and citizens' business cards in the new City Hall.

• The Council unanimously approved placing city owned properties for bid.

• The Council unanimously authorized the City Manager to proceed with the Interlocal Agreement (ILA) for the Street Rehabilitation Project with Tarrant County for 12 streets.

• A Towing Fee Ordinance establishing a \$50.00 fee was unanimously approved.

• An Abatement Administrative Fee Ordinance was unanimously approved.

Save Money at home with Water Conservation

Did you know that a home can waste up to 10,000 gallons of water a year due to dripping faucets, running toilets, and household leaks? Save water...save money now!

Indoors:

1. Turn off water when not needed.
2. Replace washers and gaskets on leaky faucets.
3. Test your toilet tank for leaks – place a few drops of food coloring in the tank; wait 15 minutes and see if color appears in the bowl. If so, replace the flapper.

4. Replace showerhead(s) with one that uses 2 gallons per minute or less

Outdoors:

1. Water only between the hours of 6 p.m. and 10 a.m.
2. Check sprinkler heads to be sure they fully operate and are not watering the driveway or sidewalks.
3. Install a rain and freeze sensor on your sprinkler system.
4. Use mulch around trees, plants and bushes to keep moisture in.

City Summer Jobs Announced

The City of Forest Hill and Workforce Solutions for Tarrant County announce two summer employment programs.

Over the next several weeks, those 18 years of age and older will have the opportunity to work, for up to 8 weeks, in various office locations throughout the city to learn work readiness skills. While working, they will earn a paycheck and experience the opportunity of working for a municipality.

To apply, you will need to complete a City of Forest Hill Job Application, attend an in-person orientation session then interview with the appropriate city personnel. Positions will be offered working with various city departments. Some applicants may be required to submit to a background check, depending on

the position sought.

Orientation sessions closest to Forest Hill will be held at the Southside Youth Center at the Resource Connection, 1400 Circle Drive in Fort Worth. Sessions are held weekdays.

You must start work by July 26th. Jobs are limited to 8 weeks based on your start date, but the last possible day of work is September 17th. Jobs pay between \$8.00 and \$10.00 per hour and you can work up to 30 hours per week. All paychecks are deposited onto a debit card on payday. You will receive your card when you complete your new hire paperwork the week before you begin your job. Your first paycheck will be deposited 2-3 weeks after you begin work and then every 2 weeks after that.

Chamber hears about Forest Hill from new city manager and scams from BBB

Forest Hill City Manager Sheyi Ipaye was first on the agenda at the June meeting of the South Tarrant Chamber of Commerce. He told the group that in spite of the sluggish economy, Forest Hill is one of the fastest growing cities in Tarrant County. He said that they plan to reduce the property tax rate and reported that 12 streets

will be improved through an interlocal agreement with Tarrant County. He promised to return and report at the September 9 Fall Kick-off Chamber luncheon.

John F. Riggins, President of the Better Business Bureau imparted valuable information on scams. He warned the group about:

- Work-at-home schemes.
- Sweepstakes with correspondence which usually begins with “Congratulations!”
- Phony business opportunities such as medical billing, movie reviews, etc.
- Vacation certificates.
- Advance fee loans.
- Reselling timeshares (reloading).
- Cramming (unauthorized charges on phone bills, etc. – could be small and almost unnoticed).
- Home improvement fraud such as driveway patching, etc.
- Scams in cyberspace.

Watering restrictions continue through summer

No lawn or landscaping watering or irrigating is permitted between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Hand watering or using soaker hoses is permitted. Hand watering is allowed while you are standing in your yard with a hose or watering can. Hoses connected to sprinklers or hoses left open-ended

are not allowed during the restricted hours.

Why the restrictions during the daytime hours? Evaporation is generally highest from 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. due to wind, sunlight and high temperatures. When you water outside of this time period, more water will seep into your landscaping, grass, trees and plants; that means less will be lost to the atmosphere because of evaporation.

Check your automatic sprinkler system timer settings. Make sure they're not set to run during the restricted time period. Citations may be issued if homeowners are not complying with these guidelines.

Use water wisely. Conservation is the key to a plentiful supply in the future. For more information about watering restrictions, call the Code Compliance officer at 817-531-5720.

Garbage Do's and Don'ts



As a reminder, residents on the north side of Interstate 20 have brush picked up the first and third weeks of the month. Residents on the south side of the interstate will be scheduled for the second and fourth weeks of the month.

Brush must be placed within five (5) feet of the curb (or your property line if no curb exists) no earlier than 7:00 a.m. Sunday morning and no later than 7:00 a.m. Monday morning to ensure your items will be picked up. What's considered "brush?" Yard waste, tree branches and trim-

mings that do not exceed 14 feet in length and one hundred (100) pounds in weight; wood fencing is also accepted. Remember, construction and remodeling materials are NOT included in this pick-up service.
