Animal Control 817-561-5495 In 2021, the Animal Control Shelter off Anglin Dr. was shut down by State officials. The building was constructed years ago but never intended to be an animal shelter. The masonry used, housed fleas/ ticks in excessive amounts & was not a good facility to keep animals. Jump to 2023 when the "Interlocal Agreement" partnership was adopted between the City of Forest Hill and the City of Everman and is now officially called "Municipal Animal Services". Both Cities have worked closely together to find a solution to the influx of animals. All animals are given the best chance at a great life thanks to the partnerships with amazing rescue groups. We work closely together to support the operation's funding, seeking grants and currently there are discussions of building a new, larger facility. Greater things are coming in the near future! Half of Lon Stephenson Rd., a portion of Anglin Dr., the westside of Wichita St. and the northside of Mansfield Hwy. belong to Fort Worth. When reporting a loose or injured animal, identify if it is Forest Hill or Fort Worth, then call the appropriate Animal Control Facility. For Fort Worth, call Animal Control 817-392-1234. All residents play a vital role in helping spread the word about spay/neutering, fostering, donations, transporting or even about the importance of microchipping and registering your pets.

TRASH & BULK TRASH PICK.UP

Forest Hill trash service is provided by Waste Connections. Each residence receives two times a week trash pickup and two times a month bulk trash pickup. To find your bulk trash pick up dates, go to foresthilltx.org, "I want to", "Brush & Bulk Collection", find your street zone and then check that month's calendar. Calling 817-568-3000 and selecting prompt 2 is another option. Reminder that bulk trash pickup does not include construction material, tires, or hazardous materials. For missed pickup or concerns, call Waste Connections at 817-222-2221.

Along with the regular scheduled waste service, the City provides recycling dumpsters located at Forest Hill Civic & Convention Center 6901 Wichita St., Police & Fire Substation 6800 Forest Hill Dr., Forest Hill Fire Department 6304 Wanda Ln. and Forest Hill Police Dept., 3336 Horton Rd.

On April 13th and November 9th, 8 a.m.-1 p.m., Parks & Rec/Clean City Commission partners with Waste Connections for Citywide Clean up for all Forest Hill residents. Bring your tree trimmings, bags of leaves, tires and debris. Items not accepted are hazardous materials, gas, oil and paint.

### FLOODING AND DRAINAGE STUDY UPDATE

The flooding and drainage study that covers Melinda, Marshall, Burly, Hartman, Crawford and more, is complete. The City's engineering company, TNP, will be providing the results soon. After the results are obtained, the City will go to work in an effort to find solutions.

## WHAT'S GOING ON IN THE CITY

How To Obtain An Accident Report - A Forest Hill Police Officer will take the initial report. The report is then submitted to Texas Department of Transportation and available within 14 days.

Crash Reports (Texas Peace Officer's Crash Report CR-3) are maintained by the Texas Department of Transportation, and their release is governed by Section 550.065 of the Texas Transportation Code.

Crash Reports can be obtained using any of these methods:

• Online purchase of accident reports generated on or after January 1 for the last ten years, for \$6.00 per regular copy & \$8.00 per certified copy through the Texas Department of Transportation (<u>https://</u> cris.dot.state.tx.us/public/Purchase).

•Purchase by mail through the Texas Department of Transportation website (http://www.txdot.gov/driver/laws/crash-reports.html). Complete the request form CR-91 and mail it with the required payment (\$6.00 per regular copy & \$8.00 per certified copy) to the address shown on the form.

To better allow individuals a chance to have a voice and the City become compliant with State Law, the Council Agendas now have "Public Testimony". Anyone can sign up, receive three minutes to talk about items on the agenda. Agenda items are the business of the Mayor and Council to move the City forward. There is a second chance to sign up and speak for three minutes during Citizens Forum which is for non-agenda items. City staff are always available to help with questions or concerns by calling 817-568-3000.

<u>VITA Volunteer Income Tax Assistance</u> - The City of Forest Hill has partnered with VITA to provide FREE income tax preparation to families and individuals with household incomes of \$64,000 or less.
